Edlesborough

Parishioners raised concern about the water levels in the balancing ponds at the Bellway Homes development. The Clerk contacted Bellway Homes to advise them of parishioners concerns. The site manager confirmed that the ponds are being monitored and the levels are high due to the recent exceptionally high rainfall. The water is only allowed to be released at a certain rate, he advised that the water level will reduce as the weather becomes drier. The current situation is that the ponds have drained to normal levels.

Home School Transport – Policy Change

Prior to the meeting the Clerk had circulated information to the full council about Bucks CC's decision to withdraw guaranteed free transport to The Cottesloe School in Wing.

Any parent with concerns about the changes should consult the BCC website or use the online admission team contact email forms for answers to any specific questions or scenarios. Lucy Chidley and Carol Lister have been working as resident liaisons with Bucks CC in response to the changes and can offer support and guidance to parents on the issue to the best of their knowledge at this time; (contact information can be obtained from the EPC Clerk).

County Cllr Anne Wight has also been looking into the issues caused by the changes to the Policy and apologises on behalf of the council for any confusion which this policy seems to have caused, she has taken that point back to officers.

Maria Edmonds who is a Bucks CC Education Strategy Manager – Children's Services has informed the Clerk that she is "liaising with officers to provide confirmation of the situation and will relay this to you as soon as possible."

Council agreed that the management of the situation has been shocking and that they fully support their parishioners in this

matter.

Residents of Slicketts Lane continue to press County Cllr Wight, The Cabinet Member & Bucks CC about the condition of Slicketts Lane. County Cllr Wight has responded to all communication and has provided the following further update - "which is that one of the residents of Slicketts Lane has reported the matter to MP Greg Smith and also to Cabinet Member Mark Shaw directly as well.

Cllr Shaw has now arranged for an officer from BCC to inspect Slicketts Lane as soon as it can be fitted into the jobs list. Unfortunately, some of these inspections may also now be delayed due to the rapidly evolving situation with Coronavirus nationally, since if any of our teams are self-isolating due to the virus, this may mean that we have fewer teams on the ground to do the inspections. While I hope this is not the case, I feel that I should at least highlight that possibility. In any case, we are all very much aware of the issues at Slicketts Lane both in terms of the gully issues and the poor road surface, and it is my understanding that one of our TfB officers should be out to inspect there as soon as possible. I'm sorry I can't be more specific as to the timing, but we are operating in exceptionally trying circumstances at present as you mav imaaine."

The Pastures Hedge

Following the clerk sending reminders to the Local Area Technician (LAT) about the outstanding invoice for The Pastures Hedge a purchase order has now been raised and sent with the invoice to Ringway Jacobs with a request that the invoice is paid by 30th March 2020.

Dagnall

A new resident of Chestnut Close, Dagnall has asked the Clerk for assistance in trying to establish ownership of the strip of land and tree at the end of the close. The resident wishes to establish who in particular is responsible for the tree as he needs to provide his home insurance company with information about this. This section is not part of EPC's devolved services. The Clerk has referred the matter to the LAT and awaits a response.

Northall

EPC was copied into an email from a Northall Parishioner to Road Safety at Bucks CC raising concern over the speeding traffic in KC



	South End Lane near the Children's play area. The Clerk has acknowledged the email and has forwarded the email to PCSO Dodson. Action: Cllr Cubbage will contact the parishioner about their concerns.	
New Pavilion	Cllr Cubbage gave a comprehensive presentation to the Council on behalf of the Pavilion Working for the EPC New Pavilion. Proposal to Fund Phases 3 and 4.	
	 Cllr Cubbage proposed that EPC apply to the Government's Public Works Loan Board for a Loan of £175,000 to be repaid over 30 years. The loan will be used to complete phases three and four of the New Pavilion on Edlesborough Green. Interest rate ~2.72% 2 repayments p.a. of ~£4,240 each (= total of ~£8,480 p.a.) This loan to be paid down/off when the \$106 monies from two of the remaining three \$106 sites become available (EPC to provide "AVDC" retrospectively with the paid invoices for Phases 3 & 4) The loan repayments would come out of EPC's Special Projects budget (£62,500 in 2020/21) 	
	• The first repayment would be due 6 months after the loan had been made Cllr Nevard seconded the proposal and the full council agreed.	
	 Resolution Edlesborough Parish Council will make a loan application, at interest rates available to local councils, to the Public Works Loan Board for £175,000 to complete phases three and four of the New Pavilion on Edlesborough Green. The loan will be over a 30 year period. 	
	 Repayments will be in the order of £8.480 per annum for principal and interest. Repayments will be made from the Special Projects fund currently in place. With the loan being paid down/off when the S106 monies from two of the remaining three S106 sites become available. There will be no effect on the Parish Precept which will not be increased to meet loan repayments.
