


Edlesborough Parish Council News (Including Edlesborough, Dagnall & Northall) June 2020

EPC held their April Ordinary Council via the Social Media Platform, Zoom. This worked very successfully. The Council will continue to hold future Council meetings via Zoom until it is deemed safe to resume holding physical public meetings.

New Pavilion – all phases funded to completion!

Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC) is delighted to announce that full funding for the completion of the new pavilion on Edlesborough Green has been achieved. As agreed at last month's EPC meeting, a loan application was made to the Government via the Public Works Loan Board for the remaining £175,000. This will enable the building to be completed and equipped.

Councillors expressed their thanks to Cllr Kevin Cubbage at the April EPC meeting for developing an excellent application for the funding.

The intention is that this loan will be repaid from future S106 funding, allocated specifically to Leisure and Sports facilities, from two of the three remaining building sites in the Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan.



EPC looks forward to the completion of the building and full opening in due course, Covid-19 conditions permitting.

EPC continues to work very closely with the Edlesborough Community Sports Club (ECSC) charity who will manage this wonderful new facility. Full details of those eligible for membership will be published shortly by ECSC but certainly all Edlesborough parishioners will have free membership.

Work has resumed on site and the contractors will be following Social Distance Guidelines whilst on site. Any concerns about this should be directed to the Parish Council via the Clerk.

Buckinghamshire Council

Both Cllr Anne Wight and Cllr Chris Poll have remained as councillors for the New Buckinghamshire Council and continue to provide much support to EPC and our parishioners.

Grass & Hedge Cutting in the Villages

Now that springtime has arrived the cutting of the grass verges has resumed. EPC requests that parishioners do not park on the grass verges as this causes damage to them and inconveniences the contractors.

EPC asks all parishioners whose hedges border the pavements to ensure that their hedges are kept well-trimmed ensuring that the maximum pavement width is available for pedestrians, pushchair and wheelchair users.



The hedge known as The Pastures hedge is scheduled to be cut by EPC's contractor in the last week of June/first week of July (this work is weather dependent).

Allotments

EPC currently has plots available at the Dagnall site. Anyone wishing to take on an allotment should contact the Clerk. Fees are £2 per pole and plots range in size from 5 – 10 poles.
