# Edlesborough Parish Council News (Including Edlesborough, Dagnall & Northall) October 2024

### **Allotments**

The annual allotment rent for 2024/25 is due to be paid at the start of October 2024. The rent due is £2.30 per pole.

EPC requests that payments are made by **internet banking**. Any tenants not able to pay by internet banking please contact the Clerk ASAP to discuss an alternative payment method.

Please ensure rent is paid by 11th October 2024, late payments will incur a £10 administration fee.

EPC currently holds a waiting list for allotment plots, anyone wishing to be added to the waiting list should contact the Clerk.

## Phase Two - Children's Play Area on Edlesborough Green

In October 2023 Council reported that the installation of the new play equipment on Edlesborough Green was complete.

At the time of writing this report it is anticipated that the upgrading of the old play equipment on Edlesborough Green will be well underway as your read this. Weather permitting, it is hoped that the installation and safety checks will all be complete and that the closed section of the play area will be reopened in mid-October.

EPC hopes that the new equipment is a welcome addition to the existing play facilities and will be enjoyed by all for many years to come.

#### Speedwatch & EDaN Traffic Management

Eagle eyed parishioners may have noticed that our three MVAS Devices disappeared over the summer. The devices were temporarily removed to protect them from the spate of theft and vandalism other devices were suffering in nearby parishes.



The three devices are now back up and recording traffic data for the Council. Each month the data is collated and shared on the EPC website Traffic Calming in the Parish
